#### **Background**

Drawing on the Port Hacking case study, The Estuary Forum 2002 documented the challenges faced in managing coasts and estuaries, including:

- **A** the ongoing transfer of use-value from the public and the less wealthy to the most wealthy;
- **B** the loss of opportunity to enjoy relatively unspoiled areas, in ways that reflect and preserve their "natural-ness":
- **C** the incremental erosion of the biophysical integrity and natural values (e.g. sub-agua and foreshore ecology);
- **D** the effective subsidisation of these processes through public funds (e.g. dredging, armouring);
- **E** the lack of accountability to achieve policy goals to redress such issues.

The Coastal Solutions Forum 2003 will focus on how these challenges can be met, in particular:

- 1 Making regulation more effective (including different ways of defining and managing property interests):
- 2 Using markets and incentives to meet social and environmental policy goals;
- 3 Different ways of ensuring the harm doers to the environment meet the full costs of that harm
- 4 Innovative ways to use voluntarism to support social and environmental objectives
- **5** Market based trading systems to manage issues like seagrass degradation and crowding of fore shores and waterways with private facilities
- **6** Achieve social goals including the effective recognition of Aboriginal interests, providing for the needs of the less advantaged, and
- Better ways of balancing and managing different types of recreational use, such as impact-costed use licences or differential rights of access.
